For one attendance with a vehicle with a view to the removal of goods (where, following the levy, goods are not removed);	Reasonable costs and fees incurred.

For the possession of goods (as described in paragraph 2 (2) of S.I. 1992 No.613: (i) For close possession (the man in possession to provide his own board): (ii) For walking possession:	£15.00 per day  £12.00
