The Town and Country Planning (Local Development) (England) Regulations 2004

On 17th January 2007, Stockton-on-Tees Borough Council adopted the Conservation Areas and Historic Environment Folder document as a Supplementary Planning Document, and in doing so, it has met the requirements of the above regulations. The document is also accompanied by a full Sustainability Appraisal Report which includes the requirements for Strategic Environmental Assessment.

The Conservation Areas and Historic Environment Folder Supplementary Planning Document will be used as a material consideration in determining planning applications.

Any person(s) aggrieved by the Conservation Areas and Historic Environment Folder Supplementary Planning Document may apply to the High Court for permission to apply for a judicial review of the decision to adopt the statement. Any such application must be made promptly and in any event not later than three months from the date of adoption.
